## **NJMLS January 09 vs. January 08 Statistics Show Bergen Single-Family Median Price Declines 5.1%**

*Condo/Co-op Median Price Increases 6.46%*

**WALDWICK, NJ – March 31, 2009** – Recently released statistics from the New Jersey Multiple Listing Service (NJMLS) for January 2009 demonstrate that the Bergen County housing market continues to re-calibrate itself, although the rate of decline eased. Data indicates that the median county-wide prices for single-family homes sold in the period declined by just 5.1%, from \$490,000 in January 2008 to \$465,000 in January 2009. Activity also decreased during the period, down 62 units, from 275 sold in January 2008 to 213 sold in January 2009. At the same time, median condo/co-op price increased 6.46%, from \$328,750 in January 2008 to \$350,000 in January 2009. Condo/co-op activity was down 31 units, from 102 sold in January 2008 to 71 sold in January 2009.

“Activity in January was affected by buyers and sellers who continued to wait it out on the sidelines,” said Gilsenan. “However, we’ve seen a surge in buyer interest at Realtor offices throughout the county. Many are first-time buyers reacting to the newly enacted tax credit, realistic home prices and historically low mortgage rates. As we enter the traditionally busy spring market, we believe that market conditions could provide strong motivation for buyers who may have previously been reluctant to purchase.”
